Matters arising None. 3 Consultations 1) Proposed core path amendment at Dalmadilly, Kemnay The Forum considered an A/C consultation paper on a proposed diversion to core path 408.05R along pre-existing routes. JD advised that the landowner and Kemnay Community Council supported the proposal. Discussion points included improved visitor experience, signage, owner's vehicular use, and environmental impact; on all of which the Forum was satisfied. CY noted that elevation to core path status would increase the potential to attract funding. Chair Action: ALOAF to write, expressing approval of the proposal. 2) Formartine and Buchan Way (FBW) Members were briefed on two temporary closures of the FBW (at Chapelton, Ellon and between Maud and Old Deer) which are required for bridge works. These have been fully publicised, including via social media. A/C contact is Katherine Low at outdoor.access@aberdeenshire.gov.uk 3) Seal haul out, Forvie Ythan Seal Watch (YSW) has contacted A/C expressing disappointment with ALOAF's response to SNH, and has stated that they would like to have had input to the response. They are dismissive of two of the issues raised in the debate. Richard Elliott (A/O) has advised YSW that if they wish to see SNH's consultation they would need to request it from SNH. It was agreed that input by YSW to the Forum's response would have been inappropriate, and ALOAF remained satisfied with its response. CY recommended that ALOAF should advise YSW that having discussed YSW's concerns. Chair the Forum's position was unchanged. It was also felt that a copy of Chair the Forum's letter to SNH should be sent to the community council.

6	Aberdeenshire Council update BF has returned from maternity leave. Katherine Low, as Environment Planner, has responsibility for the FBW and a paths maintenance portfolio. GMcK emphasised the need for continuing A/C support for its Access Officers and for ALOAF (whose work CY noted was largely voluntary). FB noted the benefit of partnership working (e.g. at events such as Countryside Live), as this encourages A/C resourcing of R/S involvement. It was agreed that A/C's new Head of Planning and Environment, Paul Macari, should be invited to meet ALOAF, preferably at Countryside Live or the Turriff Show, these being the best way of enabling him to meet members and see what the Forum does. 7	Core paths and landowner liabilities The Forum considered a	
	paper on a core path at Aboyne, in which Richard Elliott requested ALOAF's view on liability, status, signage, and maintenance (by local paths group). This would assist A/C in determining whether to remove core path status from the route. JK, (also on the local paths group) explained that riverbank erosion threatens the path, causing concern over safety and liability. The path is included in a leaflet which is nearly ready to go to print. The proposal is to move the path 1-2 metres further away from the river bank. In discussion there was a general view that closure was not an option. The pros and cons of constructing bank defences attracted a broadly equal weight of views for and against, but it was noted that such defences would be highly unlikely to be approved (although willow trees were recognised as a beneficial option). Members then considered a number of specific questions on which RE sought the Forum's advice, namely:  1 – Is there a natural and obvious danger? Yes.  2 – Are warning signs required? Not at the site but, as the path is to be promoted, there should be informational signs at termini, with photo of eroded section. Users can then decide for themselves before setting off on the path. The wording could also provide a link to an online update on the condition of the path.  3 – What should the wording read on any such sign? [See above].  4 – Are such warning signs compatible with core path status? Noted that core path designation does not oblige provision of signage.  5 – Should A/C remove core path status temporarily while a solution/diversion/alternative is sought? No.  6 Should A/C seek to remove core path status permanently? No.  7 – Does the Forum have a view on the proposal by the local paths group to carry out minor works to encourage walkers to move away from the edge of the bank and closer to the fence? In favour.  8 – Is there a desire for a site visit by ALOAF? No.  The Forum asked for an update from RE at the next ALOAF meeting.	RE

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8	<ul> <li>Ythan Estuary – Access at Newburgh CY reported an award of a Coastal Communities Fund grant of £100,000 from A/C to the Community Council, to improve visitor access at Newburgh. The existing car park will be leased from the owner and upgraded. An all-ability path will provide a view of the estuary and potentially the seals. CY asked if ALOAF would be willing to provide a letter of support for an application to the Rural Tourism Infrastructure Fund for funding which would support responsible access at the Ythan Estuary. Being satisfied with the rationale and potential benefits of the project, the Forum agreed to this request. JK observed that the car park would also facilitate access to the water.
