HUNTLY skier Andrew Musgrave recently had one of the best races of his career, shocking everyone with his performance in the Norwegian Championships.

Andrew Musgrave came second in the 15km freestyle time trial, the opening race of the Championships and the most important race of the season in Norway's national sport.

A total of 110 skiers competed in the race, including all members of the Norwegian national ski team. Conditions were difficult, with gusts of wind sometimes bringing skiers to a stand-

The race was won by a large margin of over a minute by Martin Johnsrud Sundby, but the rest of the Norwegian national team were well down the rankings when the final results came in.

In an interview after the race Andrew said that he started the race steadily but felt better and better as it went on.

Norway's star skier Petter Northug, started 30 seconds behind him and Andrew said he took the first lap steadily, expecting Northug to catch him and then his plan was to ski behind Northug and get some protection from the

> better as the race went on. Although Andrew was second in the race, he was not eligible to claim the silver medal for the Championship as he does not have Norwegian citizenship. He instead received a bouquet of flowers and was able to take part in the post-race press con-

Andrew has been training in Norway for the last two seasons and is well known to Norwegian followers of international cross-country racing. The Championships are televised live in Norway and Andrew is becoming a minor celebrity.

Two years ago while still skiing in junior races, Andrew caused a stir when he took first place in the Norwegian Junior Championships, but to beat all but one of the elite Norwegian team in the championship has been far more of a shock, with his achievements hitting the headlines.

Andrew went back to Norway two weeks ago after completing the gruelling 'Tour de Ski' series of races in the Alps where he was the first British skier to participate.
