STATEMENT OF REASONS

SOUTH PARK SCHOOL, FRASERBURGH  
PROPOSED PEAK TIME ROAD CLOSURES

Aberdeenshire Council are satisfied after a successful peak time road closure trial at South Park School, which has been in operation on Philorth Avenue and St Modans Place since May 2023, that the implementation of permanent peak time road closures will ease congestion and enhance road safety around the school.



FRASERBURGH – PROPOSED PEAK TIME ROAD CLOSURES

Aberdeenshire Council proposes to make “The Aberdeenshire Council (South Park School, Fraserburgh) (Peak Time Closure to Vehicular Traffic) Order 2024” under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984.

The effect of the order will be to prohibit any person from driving any vehicle on the lengths of road detailed below between 08:15 and 09:15 and 14:30 and 15:00.

Philorth Avenue/Mormond Avenue Junction to Philorth Avenue/Provost Milne Drive Junction

St Modans Place/Witchhill Road Junctions to St Modans Place/Philorth Avenue Junctions

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984

THE ABERDEENSHIRE COUNCIL (SOUTH PARK SCHOOL, FRASERBURGH) (PEAK TIME  
CLOSURE TO VEHICULAR TRAFFIC) ORDER 2024

Aberdeenshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred upon it under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following order:-

1. This order may be cited as “The Aberdeenshire Council (South Park School, Fraserburgh) (Peak Time Closure to Vehicular Traffic) Order 2024”, and shall come into operation on
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit any motor vehicle to enter or proceed in or on any part of the lengths of roads described in columns 1 and 2 of the Schedule to this Order, between the hours of 08:15 to 09:15 and 14:30 to 15:30 Monday to Friday.
3. Nothing in Article 2 shall apply to the vehicles specified as being exempt in the Schedule to this order.

PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES

EXEMPTIONS

For the purposes of the application of this order, where reference is made in column 3 of the Schedule to an exemption relating to a corresponding road named and described in columns 1 and 2 therein, the expression:

1	Means a motor vehicle being driven by the holder of a valid disabled person's badge, or where the holder of a valid disabled person's badge is a passenger in said motor vehicle, provided that said vehicle has conspicuously on display, so as to be clearly visible from the front of the vehicle, a valid disabled person's badge.
2	Means a goods vehicle bearing livery detailing the name of the company or organisation to which the vehicle is registered, hired, or leased, provided that said vehicle is actively engaged in delivering or collecting goods to or from premises adjacent to a length of road described in the Schedule to this order.
3	Means a liveried waste service vehicle being used by, or in the service of, a local authority for the purpose of collecting household or business waste from premises within a length of road described in the Schedule to this order.
4	Means a vehicle being used by a person or persons engaged in activities related to the provision of teaching, servicing, maintenance, or construction within South Park School.
5	Means a vehicle bearing a valid permit issued by Aberdeenshire Council, provided that said permit is otherwise valid for use in the road specified in the Schedule to this order and that: a) said vehicle requires to be used in said road for the purposes of gaining access to premises in or adjacent to said road, and b) said permit is conspicuously displayed on the vehicle at all times during which it is within said road.
6	Means a vehicle registered to a person whose main place of residence is located within a length of road described in the Schedule to this order.
7	Means a vehicle occupied by a care worker (either paid or unpaid) who is visiting a person whose main place of residence is located within a length of road described in the Schedule to

	this order.
8	Means any vehicle being used in the course of a funeral, including a hearse carrying a deceased person and any other such vehicle forming part of the funeral procession for the purpose of transporting mourners to/from a funeral service, provided that notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the Chief Executive of Aberdeenshire Council and his consent, either generally or specifically, has been obtained and such reasonable conditions he may impose are complied with.
